RULE SUMMARY

ORS 390.180(1) authorizes the Director of the Oregon Parks and Recreation Department (OPRD) to adopt administrative rules that establish a plan for each state park. Accordingly, OPRD is adopting a plan for Cottonwood Canyon State Park, a new state park on the John Day River. Plans for state parks are adopted as state rules under OAR 736-018-0045. The purpose of amending OAR 736-018-0045 is to adopt the new plan for Cottonwood Canyon as a state rule.

The plan for the park responds to the most current information on park resource conditions and public recreation needs as they pertain to this park setting. The plan was formulated through OPRD's mandated planning process involving meetings with the general public, an advisory committee, recreation user groups, environmental advocacy groups, affiliated Tribes, affected state and federal agencies and local governments, local land owners and the local Chamber of Commerce

The Agency requests public comment on whether other options should be considered for achieving the rule's substantive goals while reducing any negative economic impact of the rule on business.

Those wishing to make public comment at the 1/24/2012 meeting should register with the hearings officer between 6:00 pm and 6:45 pm on the day of the meeting.

Need for the Rule(s):

A plan for Cottonwood Canyon State Park is being adopted to provide direction to the Oregon Parks and Recreation Department (OPRD) regarding the future management of the park resources and development of facilities for public recreation access. The plan responds to the most current information on park resource conditions and public recreation needs as they pertain to this park setting. The purpose of amending OAR 736-018-0045 is to adopt, through the administrative rule process, the plan for this new park.

Documents Relied Upon, and where they are available:

Cottonwood Canyon State Park Comprehensive Plan (Draft). Available for review at the OPRD web site, http://egov.oregon.gov/OPRD/PLANS/planning_cottonwood.shtml. Hard copies and copies on CD are available upon request from the OPRD headquarters office in Salem.

Fiscal and Economic Impact:

The park plan we seek to adopt through the proposed rule amendment will provide guidance to OPRD on the management of the park resources and development of facilities for public recreation access at the Cottonwood Canyon State Park. The plan may be used as a basis for seeking funding for planned projects; however, there is no guarantee that the planned projects will be funded or developed. Neither the plan nor the rule amendment for adoption of the plan will provide the funding for the planned projects. As such, we expect no positive or negative fiscal or economic impacts due to this rulemaking action.

Statement of Cost of Compliance:

An Administrative Rule Advisory Committee has not been consulted because filing of this rule is expected to not have negative or positive fiscal or economic impacts. However, an advisory committee has assisted OPRD in formulating the draft plan for Cottonwood Canyon State Park. Committee members were chosen to represent a broad spectrum of interests related to the park resources and recreation needs. The various interests represented include public recreation providers, recreation advocacy groups, environmental advocacy groups, affiliated Tribes, affected state and federal agencies, local government agencies and elected officials, and the local community.
